Position Summary:

Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) is responsible for administering anesthetics and monitoring anesthetized patients during endoscopic procedures. While working within the guidelines and scope of practice of a CRNA, the CRNA is an integral part of the Puget Sound Gastroenterology sedation care team and works collaboratively with the gastroenterologists, nurses and patient care team.

Specific Duties and Responsibilities:

- Preoperative patient evaluation through interviewing and examining patients. Assess data to select appropriate anesthetic and administer anesthetics in accordance with clinical privileges delineated.
- Monitor, interpret and evaluate information derived from patient assessments as well as monitor intra-operatively and protect patients' life functions. Communicate with physician regarding planned anesthesia and changes in patient status.
- Work daily as part of the procedural care team, adapting to each patient's sedation needs.
- Prepare drugs and perform IV insertion hemodynamic balance and airway management in routine and acute medical situations.
- Serve as a reference for development of anesthesia protocols, policy development and training as needed.
- Ensure all needed supplies are present for anesthesia care.
